GATEWAY COURSE (3 CREDITS):

CSE110.9801 (**): Literacy & Propaganda** (3 credits; 3 hours) **Instructor: N. Yood**

This course introduces students to methods of understanding a highly developed and pervasive discourse: propaganda. Emphasis is placed on reading materials that use the persuasive and argumentative language of politics, advertising, cultural discussions and the media. Political speeches, essays, editorials, and articles are used to enlarge the students' experience with the materials and tools of propaganda. The student will acquire the intellectual framework and sophisticated level of literacy needed to recognize and respond to the aims of propaganda.

Prerequisites: 65+ ELA Regents or 75+ Eng/SS GPA; in addition, a good record of attendance is required. Students may also qualify for this course if they have successfully completed ENE099 or HUP102.

BTM101.9804 (***): Introduction to Business** (3 credits; 3 hours) **Instructor: TBA**

This is an introductory course designed to acquaint the student with the role of business in our economy, the forms of organization, and the various business functions such as management, personnel, marketing and finance. Career opportunities in the business world are also explored. This course should be taken prior to any other business courses.

Prerequisites: 75+ ELA Regents or 480+ on SAT Critical Reading or 48+ on PSAT Critical Reading. Students may also qualify for this course if they have successfully completed two Gateway courses (ENE.099 strongly recommended).

ENG101.9805 (***): Composition I** (3 credits; 4 hours) **Instructor: A. Colon**

In this course, students focus on the process of writing clear, correct and effective expository essays in response to materials drawn from culturally diverse sources. Emphasis is placed on using various methods of organization appropriate to the writer's purpose and audience. Students are introduced to argumentation, fundamental research methods and documentation procedures. Students write frequently both in and out of class.

Prerequisites: 75+ ELA Regents or 500+ on SAT Critical Reading. ENG101 is the pre-requisite for SSY101-General Psych. You have a preferred seat in SSY101 for Spring 2018 after having successfully completed ENG101 in Fall 2017.

INTRODUCTORY COURSES (3 CREDITS):

HUC106.9810 (***): Public Speaking** (3 credits; 3 hours) **Instructor: R. Celestin**

This course is designed to provide the student with a critical understanding of, and increased skill in, formal public speaking. In addition to examining oral rhetoric theory, students learn and practice skills in topic selection, research, organization, delivery and criticism of speeches.

Prerequisites: 75+ ELA Regents and 75+ Eng/SS. Students may also qualify for this course if they have successfully completed ENE099 or CSE110.

HUA125.9811 (***): Intro. to Computer Art** (3 credits; 3 hours; 2 lecture; 1 lab) **Instructor: TBA**

This course provides an introduction to all phases of computer graphics applications, including draft and paint modes, fills, textures, brushes, graphic tools and color blending through exercises in drawing, painting, graphic design, illustration and advertising techniques. Electronic publishing and software design will also be presented through field trips and videotapes. Students will have hands-on experience with microcomputers utilizing graphics, draw and paint software programs. No previous experience with computers or graphics is necessary.

Prerequisites: 65+ ELA Regents or 75+ Eng/SS. Students may also qualify for this course if they have successfully completed ENE099 or CSE110.

INTRODUCTORY SCIENCE COURSES (3 TO 4 CREDITS):

SCP101.980A/B (**): Topics in Physics** (3 credits; 3 hours) **Instructor: TBA**

This survey course for non-science majors covers major concepts in physics. Subjects included are Newtonian mechanics, conservation of energy, atomic theory, electrostatics and electricity, wave motion, light, and modern physics. Although mathematical formulas are used when necessary the emphasis is on understanding the concepts. Principles studied are applied to analyze and understand topics ranging from energy conservation and global warming to photocells and optical fibers. Practical exercises are included.

Prerequisites: 75+ on ELA and Integrated Algebra Regents.

SCB101.987A/B (***): Topics in Biological Sciences** (3 credits; 3 hours) **Instructor: D. Kizirian**

This course provides an introduction to the scientific method, the origin and organization of life, and reproduction and ecology. The relevance of modern biological theory to human life in particular areas will be emphasized using selected topics such as urban pollution and population control
